Ms. Judy's PYP 2 class hit the road on Thursday in their first field trip for the year. They toured Bathsheba in search of Chattel houses as part of their Unit of Inquiry on 'Homes'. The students had to locate and identify the traditional features of these iconic Bajan homes, such as timber construction, a steep gabled roof, a central door, shutters & louvres, and if it's elevated off the ground. The students discussed the function of these unique architectural features and then made comparisons with other dwellings in the area to ensure they were genuine Chattels.



Experiential Learning

You only had to wander into any of our PYP classrooms during the first lesson on Monday morning to get a feel for the wonderful experiential learning that takes place throughout the Primary School on any given day. Students in PYP 6 were up to their elbows creating an articulated skeletal system from anything they could get their hands on, the PYP 5 crew were blindfolded searching for their Central Idea in an archaeological dig, while our PYP 1 students were searching around campus trying to find natural and manufactured patterns.
