

PYP 3 Ornithology

Ms. Peggy's PYP 3 team of ornithologists were roaming around campus this week as part of a birdwatching task for their Unit of Inquiry on 'Local Birds & Animals'. The activity involved bird spotting, naming the birds, tallying the number of each species, and then making sketches of the birds they observed. Fortunately our beautiful campus is a haven for birdlife so there were plenty to see. Blackbirds, pigeons and sparrows were most common but the team think they may have spotted a frigate circling up from the Atlantic. Back in the classroom they wrote sentences describing the bird's actions and movement.







PYP 5 at Welchman Hall Gully

Ms. Barbara's PYP 5 class hit the road today on a field trip to Welshman Hall Gully. The students are currently studying how living things function, interact and adapt within their environment so 'The Gully' was the perfect location for a wild, hands-on experience. The students explored the tropical rainforest habitat looking for living things and examining the specific adaptations they've made to survive in the forest.

Some of Ms. Suzie's PYP 7 students visited the Design Technology workshop in the Secondary School today to commence work on a bespoke display unit they are creating for presenting information. The design of the display was inspired by a recent class visit to the Exchange Museum in Bridgetown. It's a collaborative effort by all PYP 7 students and will hopefully be incorporated in their next Celebration of Learning in December.

A significant focus in our teaching and learning at Codrington is developing independence in our students. This is particularly important in our lower grades where our youngest students are still in the early stages of building their self-reliance, self-confidence and sense of belonging.

The long trek from the bus or the campus front gate in the morning is a good litmus test for the bravery and independence of our 3 and 4 year olds. We're there for them if they need us of course, but it's a still a big challenge to 'walk the walk' to their classroom door at the commencement of each school day. It's always a delight to see our youngest inquirers steel themselves and work their way through this important rite of passage.
