### On the road with PYP 3

Ms. Peggy's PYP 3 team enjoyed a big week of experiential learning this week. They traveled to Marizayra Sanctuary in Harrismith on Wednesday and to the Went farm in Christ Church on Thursday. They were making some excellent connections to their Unit of Inquiry on 'Animals' and seized the opportunity to see an eclectic collection of animals first hand. They got up close and touchy-feely with snakes, lizards, tortoises, horses, macaws, rabbits and galahs to name a few.



### **Environmental Print**

Our youngest inquirers, Ms. Carla's PYP 1 students, explored the school campus on Wednesday morning searching for examples of 'environmental print'. They looked for signs, labels & logos with different letters, colours, numbers & shapes. They used iPads to photograph the print as they roamed the campus. 'Reading' environmental print is an important step in early literacy and a pre-curser to alphabet & letter recognition. Wednesday's activity enabled students to find & record examples of the functional text they see in everyday life.





### **Slippery Critter**

After a third and unsuccessful modification of their mongoose trap, Ms. Peggy's PYP 3 class are conceding defeat. The trap became more of an Uber Eats service for the slippery critter, as the raw egg and pieces of chicken disappeared without a trace on Wednesday. It has however, been a valuable learning experience for the PYP 3 students. The collaboration, the design process, the problem-solving, the trial & error, the setbacks, etc. are all aspects of this challenge that can be drawn upon in future activities.
